The following was sent to me by Mark Beilman.

My name is Mark Beilman, 4953 Bailey Road Delavan. I attended the listening session for Williams Bay schools last week and they are telling us they are getting their contact tracing and quarantine guidelines from the the department of HHS. I called HHS and spoke to Gaby Manders and she says this is not the case. Who to believe? I know the guidelines if followed will treat students differently when contact tracing thus showing everyone the families health decision. This was very concerning to myself and many parents. The policy states that if you have had the COVID Vax you do not need to quarantine if you have been in contact with someone with COVID, no vax people have to quarantine for 14 days. the CDC just came out this week and said the COVID vax does not stop transmissibility of the virus. I'm sure it will be something different next week with the CDC. I am in favor of having the choice to either wear masks or not and to eliminate contract tracing all together. The kids need to be able to breathe freely at school and not be going in and out of school like they did last year. I would like to have the HHS board take this up as an agenda item to discuss further how the HHS is handling information going to our schools.
